ABOUT THE NEW CABALLEROS



Richard Bigg

Richard Bigg started working life as a commodity broker in the City, and graduated to the hospitality sector. His first bar won Time Out Bar of the Year in 1997, fast forward 10 years and he opened Camino (the first of a series) in Kings Cross: 'the idea was to move away from other businesses and concentrate on combining my love of bars and restaurants with my love of Spain'. In 2008 it won Observer Food Monthly Best Bar in Britain. In 2010 he launched Bar Pepito (Britain's first dedicated Sherry bar) and in 2014 he won Best Spanish Wine List UK from the Imbibe Louis Roederer Awards.



Manuel Muga

Manuel Muga is the current Executive Vice-president of Bodegas Muga. He has a degree in Economics and Business Sciences from the University of the Basque Country.

After completing his academic training, Manuel moved to France where he worked in La Mondiale, a major international insurance company and, after returning to Spain, he continued his professional career in the financial sector, working in MAPFRE another prestigious company of Spanish origin. Diageo, one of the world's largest producers of spirits and beers was the last company he worked for until in 1994, as a member of the family's third generation, he joined Bodegas Muga.



Norrel Robertson MW was born and raised in Scotland, Norrel graduated from Aberdeen University and has been in the wine business since 1993.

After posts in sales, buying and product development he worked in Europe and the New World learning how to make wine from the mid to late 1990s. He became an MW in 2000 winning the Mondavi Award and then studied the Postgraduate Diploma in Viticulture and Oenology at Lincoln University, New Zealand, passing with Distinction. In 2003 he moved to Spain as a group winemaker for International Wine Services.

Running winemaking projects across Spain, he fell in love with the old vineyards of Aragón, many of which he has bought and since saved from extinction as he set up the company 'El Escocés Volante'. He and his

family currently own 25 hectares of primarily old vine Garnacha in the Sistema Ibérico, as well as making wines and consulting across other regions of Spain.



About the GOCV

The **Gran Orden de Caballeros del Vino (GOCV)** was established in 1985 by <u>Wines from Spain</u> to recognise and reward outstanding achievement in the education, advancement and business of quality wines from Spain in the United Kingdom.

Since then, the Order has invited <u>82 members</u> of the wine trade to join, in recognition of their unique contributions. The new members are inaugurated at the annual investiture dinner in central London. Among their number are winemakers, winery owners, importers, retailers, restaurateurs, educators, journalists and broadcasters. Led by a small team of committee members, the GOCV provides an unrivalled network for Spanish wines in the UK.

Translated literally, each member is officially 'a knight of the great order of wine' and once accepted into the GOCV members continue their support of wines from Spain by promoting the work and events of the whole Spanish wine community across the UK, in Spain and around the world.
